Emergency Food Resources Oakland, Macomb, and Wayne Counties

Michigan Department of Health & Human Services (MDHHS) has increased existing food assistance programs and added new ones to assist families with children with food during the COVID-19 pandemic. If you need help with food, you may apply for these benefits online. If you don't have a MI Bridges account, you'll have to create one online first at MDHHS's client portal web site: www.michigan.gov/mibridges. MI Bridges is a self-service tool to apply for benefits, manage your case, view benefits/letters, and locate state/local resources near you.

Do you need help resetting your MI Bridges password/username or other technical assistance while using the MI Bridges web site to apply for benefits or manage your case? Call the Help Desk at 844-799-9876 or read the FAQs by [clicking here](#). The Help Desk is open Monday through Friday from 8:00AM-7:00PM.

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

SNAP provides food assistance to low-income individuals and families. In response to the coronavirus pandemic, on March 27, Michigan increased all SNAP recipients to the maximum benefit amount for March and April and waived the federal work requirement for able-bodied adults without dependents who receive SNAP.



Eligibility Requirements: Income eligibility limits for Michigan's food assistance program are [listed here](#). SNAP recipients will automatically receive the following maximum monthly benefit amount for *March, April, May, and June* based on their household size:

- One person: \$194
- Two people: \$355
- Three people: \$509
- Four people: \$646
- Five people: \$768
- Six people: \$921
- Seven people: \$1,018
- Eight people: \$1,164

The federal work requirement, which was set to take effect April 1, applies to able-bodied adults ages 18-49 without dependents. A change in federal regulations would have prohibited those adults from receiving food assistance for more than three months within a three-year period, unless they meet certain work requirements. During the coronavirus outbreak, this work requirement is suspended.

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) *(continued)*

How to Access: People already receiving SNAP benefits do not need to take any action to receive the maximum benefit amount or have the work requirement waived. People may apply for SNAP benefits through [MI Bridges](#).

Program End Date: Maximum SNAP benefits amounts will be offered in *March, April, May, and June*. The work requirement waiver is in effect through the end of the month after the month when the COVID-19 public health emergency declaration is lifted by the secretary of U.S. Health and Human Services.

Double Up Food Bucks Spending Limit Increase

Double Up Food Bucks allows families enrolled in the Food Assistance Program with EBT/Bridge Cards to double their food dollars to spend on fruits and vegetables at participating stores and farmers markets. During the COVID-19 crisis, many stores that participate in Double Up Food Bucks have increased their \$20 per day spending limit. [Click here](#) to see how the program works.



How to Access: Spartan Nash stores, which include Family Fare, VG's, and ValuLand have increased their Double Up Food Bucks spending limit to \$50 per day; other stores may have also increased their spending limits. Search the [Double Up Food Bucks online database](#) to find participating stores and farmers markets near you. Some stores may have changed their hours of operation during the coronavirus pandemic, so it's best to call ahead for more details.



Low-income College Students enrolled in qualifying Career and Technical Education (CTE) Programs

As of May 5, college students are eligible for SNAP if they meet income, other program requirements, all requirements of the Food Assistance Program, and are enrolled at least half-time in an occupational program that leads to employment under the **Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the Twenty-First Century Act of 2018 known as Perkins V**. Michigan Department of Education's 'Meet Up and Eat Up' Summer Food Service Program (SFSP)



The Michigan Department of Education's Summer Food Service Program, also known as 'Meet Up and Eat Up', helps ensure school-aged children still have access to healthy meals when schools are closed. *Meals are available to children 18 years of age and under and persons up to age 26 who are enrolled in an educational program for the mentally or physically disabled that is recognized by a State or local public educational agency.* Meals are provided without regard to race, color, national origin, age, sex, or disability.



Using EBT/Bridge Card Online for Grocery Delivery

On May 20, the USDA approved Michigan retailers to accept SNAP benefits (EBT/Bridge Card payments) online. This is wonderful news, especially for individuals who are homebound with their Bridge Card as their only means to buy groceries and have them delivered. Currently, [Amazon](#) and [Walmart](#) are accepting Bridge Card payments online.

Purchases can be made on eligible food items just as one would use a credit or debit card for an online purchase.



Delivery Fees

SNAP benefits cannot be used to pay for delivery fees. Curbside pick-up is available at Walmart to avoid a delivery fee. Amazon is currently offering free delivery for orders over \$35.

Cash Assistance and WIC Benefits

Anyone who has cash assistance benefits loaded onto their Bridge Card will not be able to use the cash benefits for online purchases. Women, Infants and Children (WIC) benefits also cannot be used for online purchases.

Questions about Your Bridge Card?

Contact a customer service representative toll-free at 888-678-8914 if you:

- Have a lost or stolen card.
- Suspect someone else is using your card.
- Have trouble with your card.
- Forgot or want to change your PIN.
- Need to know your food and/or cash benefits balance and cannot find your last store receipt.
- Want to know a location nearby to use your card.

Customer service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week (Spanish and Arabic service is available). If you are deaf, deafblind, hard of hearing, or speech-impaired, call the Michigan Relay Center at 7-1-1.

Meal and Food Delivery for Seniors

Homebound seniors 60+ in Michigan who need extra support during the current pandemic may now qualify for meal delivery, delivery of non-perishable food boxes, and optional daily wellness-check calls through their local Area Agency on Aging.



A food box is filled with 33 food items that provides for 22 well-balanced, nutritious meals. Each box contains breakfast, lunch and dinner recipes for seniors who are food insecure. It contains food such as chunk white canned chicken, green beans, peanut butter and low sodium diced tomatoes.
