Oakland County

South Oakland Shelter [SOS]

SOS maintains 30-35 unrestricted shelter beds and accepts **men, women, and children. If you need shelter, you must call daily at 10:00AM Monday through Friday to see if they have space.** Residents receive access on a first call, first serve basis. The address below is not the overnight shelter. SOS partners with over 60 congregations on a weekly rotation for overnight shelter and operates year-round. Each week, a congregation takes on the responsibility of hosting SOS's shelter residents and provides them with overnight accommodations, three daily meals, transportation, and meaningful interactions with caring volunteers. SOS has an on-site clothing closet, showers, and washers and dryers and offers case management to their residents. Over 80% of their shelter residents successfully enter into housing.

HOPE Adult Shelter

Emergency shelter for **adult men and women.** Residents can shower on the premises and are provided dinner, light breakfast some mornings, and bag lunches. HOPE is a low-barrier shelter; sobriety is not required but there is zero tolerance for alcohol or drug use on the premises. HOPE provides a mailing address for residents; will also help residents obtain a state ID if needed. Operates year-round.

Intake begins nightly at 5:00PM. **If you need shelter, you must arrive in person at 5:00PM for intake to see if there are open beds.** They accept residents that stayed the previous night first. If there are open beds, they will accept new residents. ID is not required for admittance.

HAVEN's residential program is Oakland County's only 24-hour emergency shelter exclusively for **domestic violence and sexual assault victims** and their children. Farber Family Pet Center will provide a secure space for the companion animals of domestic and sexual violence survivors living at the shelter. If you need a place to go, call our **24-hour Crisis and Support line at 248-334-1274** or [click here](#) to chat with us online. This is the only way to access our shelter. Every victim is asked to go through a screening process before coming into the shelter. Screenings for the shelter are done through the crisis and support line. A safe and home-like transitional living shelter where homeless **youth ages 16-17** may stay for up to two years while they attend school and maintain employment. Designed for youth seeking self-sufficiency, this program also offers counseling, job training, career development, educational assistance, financial subsidies, and medical assistance.

Common Ground: Graduated Apartment Program

The Graduated Apartment Program (GAP) provides independent living services for homeless **youth ages 18-24**. GAP offers up to 24 months of housing, case management, counseling, and educational and employment support to help people develop a greater level of self-sufficiency, interpersonal skills and housing readiness.

Lighthouse of Oakland County

Lighthouse provides direct services (food, shelter, rental/utility and other financial assistance, clothing, crisis referrals), stability and housing programs that develop and support self-sufficiency. Their work is centered around building communities that end homelessness and helping people move from crisis toward self-sufficiency.

Financial assistance is available to help pay rent, utilities, and moving expenses as well as security and utility deposits. Housing relocation and stabilization services include case management, outreach, engagement, housing search, and placement.

FYI also has a 24-hour crisis line for youth, families and those interested in referring a youth to the program. We provide safe spaces for young people to have their basic needs met, be listened to and respected, discover more of their strengths and talents and learn coping and resiliency skills. FYI can also be a place to start thinking about a positive future. We understand that most of the young people and their families interested or involved in our programs have had some tough or traumatic life experiences. FYI does not take health insurance and is free to youth and families. Also offers 90-day outpatient counseling.

ChristNet

ChristNet provides temporary overnight shelter, a daytime program, and other services to homeless **men, women, and children**. They provide a safe secure sleeping space indoors; offer three meals per day; and a case manager who identifies and coordinates mainstream resources to help those in need restabilize their lives. Guests may stay for up to 90 consecutive days while they seek a more permanent solution to their living situation.

ChristNet's Nighttime Shelter Program is a **seasonal shelter program open from the second Sunday in October through the end of May**. ChristNet Services Intake Center is located in the lower level of the Taylor Church of the Nazarene. **Guests in need of shelter should call the office at 734-287-8890, Monday through Sunday between the hours of 7:00-10:00AM**. At that time, they'll be able to inform you if they have any openings.

ChristNet's Daytime Program links homeless men and women in the Downriver Detroit communities with available services and resources in a daytime setting that can help them secure appropriate health services, more stable housing, and job skill development that will facilitate employment.
